1. Control of Seizures N.B Maintenance therapy should only be used on direction of Consultant

2. Management of Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS)

AGE	DOSE	FREQUENCY	ROUTE
Birth to 1 month	Loading Dose	SINGLE	- Oral
	15mg/kg/dose	SINGLE	
	Maintenance dose*	ONCE doily	
	8mg/kg /dose	ONCE daily	

<sup>\*</sup> Maintenance dose starts 24 hours after loading dose.

Approximate time to steady state 10-14 days

Target Blood concentration 10-40mg/L
