Artesunate

FORM Vial containing 60mg powder for reconstitution for injection.

INDICATION Treatment of congenital malaria, named patient use

DOSE RANGE

AGE	DOSE	FREQUENCY	ROUTE
Neonate	3mg/kg	Loading dose: 3 doses 12 hours apart followed by Maintenance dose:	IV
		24hrly	

Add 1ml of sodium bicarbonate 5% (provided with drug) to a 60mg vial Shake the vial until the solution is clear, inserting a venting needle to allow accumulated gas to escape

Dilution

FURTHER DILUTE with 5ml of sodium chloride 0.9%, giving a 10mg in 1ml solution Swirl to mix

Use within 1 hour of reconstitution

Administration

Use required volume for dose and give by slow IV injection over 1-2 minutes Flush with sodium chloride 0.9%

No adjustment for hepatic or renal impairment required.

Monitor patient for hypersensitivity reactions. Fever, bradycardia, vomiting and diarrhoea may occur. Jaundice – monitor for delayed haemolysis post treatment (~2 weeks) as advised by Paediatric Infectious Diseases Team; acute renal failure and haemoglobinuria may occur

STORAGE Vials should be stored below 25 degrees and protected from light until

reconstituted.
